

## A Letter from Bishop Eaton

From the Presiding Bishop,

"When you pass through the waters, I will be with you, and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you." (Isaiah 43:2).

Dear First Lutheran of Redlands,

The images of leaping flames, smoke-choked skies, and the wreckage of homes and habitats in and around Los Angeles are hard to bear. The ongoing, deadly California wildfires have claimed lives, displaced hundreds of thousands of people, and destroyed homes, businesses, schools and houses of worship. The devastation continues as winds spread the flames. So far we know that Bishop Brenda Bos of the Southwest California Synod and her wife, Janis, lost their home in the Eaton fire. We believe that the fires have touched the lives of many more ELCA members and several congregations as the synod continues to receive damage reports and assess the immediate needs for support.

The prophet Isaiah writes that even when fires rage, the final word is faith, not fear. God redeems us and calls us by name to be agents of healing and hope, even amid staggering loss. In faith, we respond through prayer, accompaniment and action.

Please join me in praying that God's love and care be manifest among all who are impacted by these wildfires. Pray for the firefighters battling unrelenting blazes and for first responders, health care providers and public servants providing safety and support for those impacted. Pray for ELCA ministries as they care for the many needs of their communities. Pray for

May the God of loving presence be with everyone who is suffering this day, including Bp. Brenda and Janis.

### A Letter from the Pastor

#### Dear Faithful Siblings

A few weeks ago I mentioned in a sermon that we included in the 2025 budget a line item for special musicians for contemporary music once a month. I asked folks to open their hearts and minds to trying something new. I encouraged folks to give at least 1% more than they were before to fund this endeavor and I pledged to give 5% more than I was giving in 2024.

I want to follow up on that and provide some good news. At the end of the year we received a couple of generous offerings that closed the gap between what we budgeted for 2024 and what we received. These offerings have become a pattern from folks who are utilizing their retirement plan's distributed giving to give to our congregation. These gifts are truly a blessing and the folks trying to balance the budget are grateful for their appearance. However, let's not allow the generosity of others prevent us from committing to our own giving. Receiving even a few dollars more each month will enable us to take care of much needed repairs and maintenance on the property and will permit us to focus on other ministries to bring the good news of God's saving love to our neighbors.

Back to the proposed contemporary music for 2025... At this point it is an idea that needs to be fully fleshed out and planned. We will need to find a guitarist (or two), etc. I will be forming a committee that will brainstorm and plan this for 2025 and then reevaluate after a few services to see if it is making a difference in people's lives. If you're interested in helping in this area, let me know.

I understand that some prefer hymns to contemporary worship music. I invite you to consider that there are folks in our midst who would prefer to hear modern worship music but still appreciate the hymns and do not let that prevent them from worshiping on Sunday. In addition, it has been suggested that incorporating contemporary music may draw younger families. Lastly, some of our treasured hymns can also be played on a guitar.

I want to assure you that we are nowhere near splitting worship services. Not even close. We are trying out different music and a less formal liturgy once a month but we will not skimp on the essentials: confession and forgiveness, gospel message, prayers of the people, and communion. The Triune God shows up whether the organ is playing a hymn or a guitar is playing modern praise music. As a matter of fact, God is always present no matter the circumstance. It's up to us to acknowledge God's presence and

The 2025 National Day of Racial Healing (NDORH) will be held on Tuesday, Jan. 21. It is an annual observance that follows Martin Luther King Jr. Day.

This year, the ELCA, in partnership with Augsburg Fortress, will join the movement of racial healing for our church and the nation. On Jan. 21, 2025, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Central time, the ELCA will feature a free online educational event that centers the voices of ELCA leaders of color. We welcome all ELCA synods, congregations, colleges, universities, seminaries, separately incorporated ministries and antiracism teams, as well as the church's affiliate organizations and ecumenical and interreligious partners.




